## about

ZAMA is an acoustic art brand that transforms everyday soundscapes into serene, sensory environments through sustainable materials, thoughtful design, and artistic expression.

We offer acoustic wall coverings that provide excellent sound absorption—designed to resemble the ideal structure of soundproofed walls.

The name ZAMA originates from Sanskrit, meaning “quiet,” “rest,” and “peace.”

These panels are not only highly functional, but also serve as striking wall art. No heavy construction is required—even full-wall installations are simple and unobtrusive. You can mix and match designs and colors to create a personalized space that reflects your style.

Each piece is crafted with a hemp surface fabric, backed by insulation board and cork for moisture regulation and year-round comfort.

Whether in offices, homes, retail spaces, or children’s rooms, ZAMA enhances acoustics, supports privacy, and brings a calming presence to any interior.

## tranquility in design

Wall art that softens harsh, high-frequency sounds and everyday noise. As time spent at home increases, so do noise-related challenges. In fact, noise is one of the leading causes of disputes among neighbors. Sound issues are hard to visualize—and even harder to solve. What's tolerable to one person may be deeply stressful to another. ZAMA provides a sustainable solution to reduce daily noise, making your living environment more peaceful and comfortable.

## sustainable materials. lasting comfort

ZAMA panels are built using eco-friendly materials. The sound-absorbing core includes high-density insulation used in architectural construction, reducing high-pitched echoes. The outer surface is decorated with fabric made from hemp, a fast-growing, pesticide-free plant known for its antibacterial and deodorizing qualities. Hemp is a zero-waste plant that improves soil and supports a circular economy—making it a true "miracle plant."

## purify your space

The hemp used in ZAMA panels is a sacred plant in Japan, long used in Shinto rituals for purification. From shimenawa (sacred ropes) to haraegushi (ritual wands), hemp has been used to cleanse and protect. For added purification, our panels can be treated with a photocatalytic coating that breaks down harmful substances such as bacteria, viruses, VOCs, odors, and pollutants—keeping your space even cleaner.

## effortless installation & portability

The key to a soundproof wall lies in combining materials that absorb and block sound. While ideal soundproof walls typically require construction work, ZAMA panels are designed to mimic that structure—layering sound-insulating materials—without requiring installation work. They are removable and can be attached to walls with double-sided tape or screws, depending on the surface. This means they're suitable for rental homes and can be taken with you when moving.

A functional wall art that enhances both air and sound quality.

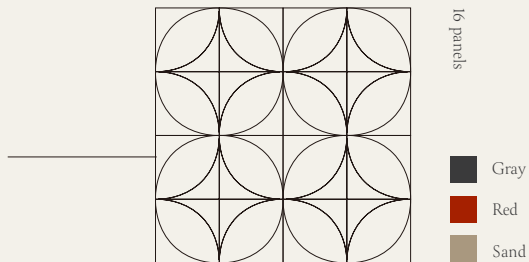

Many modern sound-absorbing materials are non-recyclable or petroleum-based.

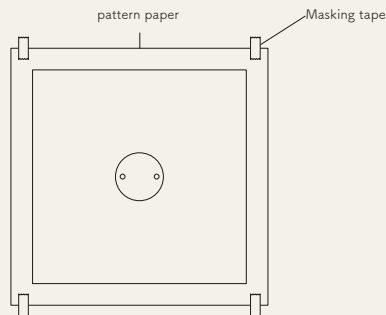
We prioritize natural materials in consideration of environmental issues and health concerns such as chemical sensitivities.



## how to install

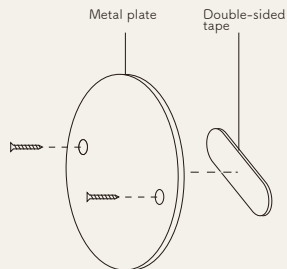
### step 1

Use the included pattern paper to determine where to place the magnets on the wall.



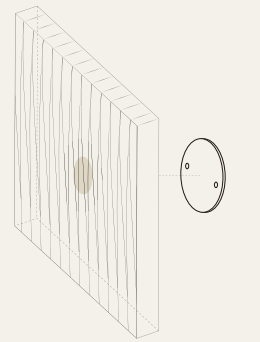
### step 2

Depending on your wall type, secure the metal plates using double-sided tape or screws.



### step 3

Attach the magnets on the back of the panel to the metal plates on the wall.
